# Feeding the Hungry in Sri Lanka

#### **Dear Friends**

We hope that you, your family and friends have all coped well with the past 6 months of the COVID-19 pandemic. We feel it is time to touch base with all of you, the people without whom Oru Paanai (OP) would not have been able to render invaluable help to our less fortunate brothers and sisters in our homeland.

We thank you for your continued support and prayers for the ongoing work in Sri Lanka.

### What has Oru Paanai done to help those affected by Covid19 in Sri Lanka?

When Covid 19 first hit Sri Lanka, and as an island wide curfew was imposed, all the dry ration distributions and annathanams (rice meals) we had been providing to the elderly destitute came to a halt. The curfew meant that many breadwinners were suddenly unemployed and could not put food on the table. OP, responding to an appeal from a group of Jaffna medical students distributing dry rations to the most needy in the north, contributed LKR 500,000 to help their wonderful work.

In response to a request from the chairman of OP SL, Mr. Skandakumar, who had seen first hand how badly affected the upcountry people were, **OP contributed LKR 150,000 to help those worst affected.** These were emergency humanitarian steps and we were glad to be able to help.

## Has Oru Paanai resumed its normal activities?

We are very glad to report that when the GoSL had started to relax its restrictions, OP promptly resumed its much needed work of feeding the hungry. We are now providing dry rations again to all the 500 elders we were supporting in the north and Wanni, and we have now even extended our program to include 200 more elders in the eastern province, as well as two estate areas in Nanu Oya. These elderly or disabled people we provide dry rations to, are marginalised and vulnerable, and most of them are over 75 years old. They have no regular income. In other words, our assistance is critical to them and gives them hope for survival.

Our provision of sathu ma, a nutritional supplement, to malnourished children of preschool age has also been resumed at the same level it was at before the pandemic.

Construction of much appreciated wells also continues apace and we hope to construct 30 more wells in 2020.

#### How can Oru Paanai sustain its activities in the current circumstances?

Due to the social distancing restrictions following Covid, our fund raising events have to be halted. Friends, we have to admit it is going to be a huge challenge - a struggle to raise funds post Covid. We need £60,000 a year to keep up the work of feeding. The construction of 30 wells each year cost us an additional £25,000.

Donations from our regular donors amounts to about  $\pounds$  20,000 per year. We used to bridge the gap until now by holding fund raising events – dances, concerts, sponsored bicycle rides – etc. All such events have come to a grinding halt due to the social distancing requirements and we cannot foresee when they can be staged again - probably not in the next 18 months at least.

OP has limited reserves to dip into to help us to continue our activities. Like every charity, OP is also facing a serious crisis in fund raising.
